

HASLEMERE ALE TRAIL The Central Saunter

ROUTE - STATION TO HIGH STREET LOOP

For the short central walk turn left out of Haslemere Station and walk turning left into Tanners Lane. Cross the road and enter the Town Meadow following the path on its left past the playground on your right. Continue to follow the path until it emerges at Haslemere Fire Station. Turn right into West Street, and continue to the end where it meets the High Street.

OPPORTUNITY TO PROCEED LEFT UP THE HIGH STREET TOWARDS THE MUSEUM TO THE SWAN BARN WALK.

Cross the High Street at the pedestrian crossing turn right and you will see The White Horse





OPPORTUNITY TO WALK TO BLACK DOWN VIA PETWORTH ROAD & MUSEUM HILL.

Proceed right out of the Swan Inn and cross at the zebra crossing just past Shepherds Hill. Continue along Lower Street on the High Pavement, you can bear left if you like through the trees on the footpath. Continue past the entrance to Tanners Lane and you will be back at Haslemere Station.

HASLEMERE ALE TRAIL

Total Distance: 5.3 miles / 8.5 kms

WALK

A two part walk linking pubs & optional extensions via a short central and longer western section, starting and finishing at Haslemere Station.

WALK TYPE EASY TO MODERATE















ROUTE - WEY HILL, SHOTTERMILL & HAMMER VALE

1 Start at Haslemere Station and turn right proceeding on the main road towards Wey Hill and under the railway bridge. Continue up the hill with St Christopher's Green on your right. Continue down the hill until the shops finish and turn right at the edge of Lion Green. You have reached the first pub, **The Apple Tree.** 2

OPTION TO EXTEND WALK TO DEVILS PUNCH BOWL MAPS 3 OR 5 VIA LION LANE & POLECAT VALLEY

Go back on the main road and cross at the lights. Continue along the road and opposite the Esso Petrol Station is Dylans, an excellent ice cream parlour and coffee shop. Continue along the road until it forks and take the left fork, Liphook Road.

Continue over the lights by St Stephens Church, then turn right along Critchmere Lane just before the railway bridge. Continue until the road bends to the right, then turn left into Border Road, then turn right into Pitfold Avenue and then left into Oak Tree Lane. Continue right to the end where you will find a footpath on the left corner. Walk all the way to the end, bear left by the stream and you will reach the road. Turn right along Hammer Lane and you will reach The Prince of Wales on your right.

OPTION TO EXTEND YOUR WALK EXPOLORING BRAMSHOTT COMMON FROM THE PUB CAR PARK


Turn left and return along Hammer Lane but don't turn off until after you have crossed the bridge when you will see Copse Road on your left. Walk all the way to the end, it will bear round to the right up a hill and at the main road turn left. Walk all the way along this road until you reach a roundabout at Shottermill Ponds. Turn left and you will see **The Mill** 4

OPTION TO VISIT SHOTTERMILL PONDS OR WALK UP ONTO MARLEY OR LYNCHMERE COMMONS

Turn left out of The Mill and proceed up the Liphook Road towards Haslemere, cross the road and then turn right onto the public footpath just before the railway bridge. Walk all the way to the end where you will meet Sturt Road. Cross where safe and turn right and proceed up the hill and then left into Kings Road. Walk all the way to the end you will reach a junction with Haslemere Station facing you and Harpers Steakhouse to your right.
